# Be a Champion • Be Excellent

# SAFETY

Safely Arrive on Scene "Be quick, don't hurry!"

#### Security

Seek out threats upon arrival to the area. Be "intentionally aware" of your surroundings.

> WIN/WIN\* Be alert for ambushes.

**Information Hunting** Arrive looking for victims, suspects, and witnesses associated with the event.

**Tactics Before Medicine** Look for threats at the scene.

**Provide Medical Attention** 

**Install Overwatch Tactics** 

**Professionalism and Demeanor** Respect is an officer safety issue.

# CASE OFFICER

Contact and Control

Communication

Request Backup Officers

WIN/WIN\*

**Incident Command** Establish yourself as the incident commander.

**Authority** Know your legal authority with suspects/victims/witnesses.

> Avoid Complacency Be intentionally aware!

Emotional Intelligence Self-awareness Self-management (Know your triggers.)

Use tactical breathing.

EVIDENCE

**Evidence Preservation** Avoid crime scene contamination.

Identify other resources needed at the scene for evidence preservation and collection.

#### WIN/WIN\*

Establish a Perimeter Establish inner/outer boundaries.

Establish a Crime Scene Log Document the entry/exit of all personnel at the scene and control the flow.

Maintain Evidence Integrity Maintain and protect the chain of custody.

# NOTIFICATION

**Notify Chain of Command** Contact supervision, detectives, and crime scene technicians.

#### **Note Taking**

Take accurate and complete notes: who, what, where, when, how, names, dates of birth, addresses, phone numbers, descriptions, tattoos, marking, gait, date, time, vehicles, registrations, etc.

### WIN/WIN\*

Neighborhood Canvass Be tactically sound. Use interpersonal skills.
